
What to do if you have a Traffic Accident

You'll be confused by a sudden accident. Let's study now so that we can act calmly at that time of accident. Collisions between bicycles and cars also occur frequently. First of all, confirm the name and contact information of the person involved in the accident and diagnosis by a doctor.

1	Park the car or bicycle in a safe place to prevent secondary disasters.
2	Call 119 Call 119 if there is any injured person.
3	Call police 110.
	 Do not leave the location of the accident until police officers arrive. When the police officer arrives, explain the situation of the accident. Then the police officer will confirm the accident site.
4	Go to the hospital Even if you think that you were slightly injured when the accident occurred, you may actually be seriously injured. You should go to the hospital as soon as possible and see a doctor.
5	 Apply for a "traffic accident certificate" A "traffic accident certificate" is required for various procedures related to traffic accidents, such as when receiving insurance money. As a general rule, a "traffic accident certificate" cannot be issued after 5 years passed since the accident occurred for personal injury and 3 years have passed since the accident occurred for personal injury and 3 years have passed since the accident occurred for property accidents. Even if you think you don't need it right after a car accident, you may need it after a few years in some cases. You should get a certificate, especially in case of death or serious injury. *Insurance of a "traffic accident certificate" requires notification to the police. Please be sure to report to the police.
	How to apply You can get an application form at the Japan Safe Driving Center, police station, police box, non-life insurance company, and others. After filling in the required items, submit the application form. You can apply by mail, at the counter, or via the Internet. For details, please see the website of Japan Safe Driving Center.

I have a son who is in the 4th grade of elementary school. It has been 6 months since he came to Japan and he is being bullied at school. The other day he couldn't stand it and when he bullied the other person, he was called by the principal. In China, it is common sense to make up for each other after fighting. Does he have to put up with it in Japan?

When living in Japan, I think it's easier to live according to Japanese rules to some extent. The school is a small society. Bullying is not allowed even at school. It is also necessary to encourage schools to end bullying. For that reason, please listen to your son's story.

I am a public assistance recipient. I'm hiding a friend who is running away from domestic violence. Please donate groceries.

The public assistance recipient cannot protect others. Please advise the DV department of the city hall to consult immediately. "Hiding friends" is considered fraudulent and public assistance may be discontinued. The public assistance recipients have several obligations in addition to "don't let others stay at home".

- (1) Don't send the public assistance fee to your home country.
- (2) Don't use it to repay your debt.
- (3) Don't buy unnecessary or luxury items.
- (4) When returning to your home country temporary, contact the case worker (no public assistance fee will be charged during that time)
- (5) Restrict alcohol, smoking and gambling.
- (6) If you have income, report the income status to the caseworker.

Do not waste the public assistance fee. You should find a job that suits your abilities as soon as possible and try to be independent.
